

# AHES Research Prize 2011

AHES has instituted an award to promote excellence in research by Australasian health economists. The Society is now calling for nominations for the 2011 prize.

Nominations using the following nomination form should be sent to the President of AHES, A/Prof Rosalie Viney ([rosalie.viney@chere.uts.edu.au](mailto:rosalie.viney@chere.uts.edu.au)). To be eligible, nominations should be received by Monday 1<sup>st</sup> August, 2011. The prize will be awarded at the 33<sup>rd</sup> Australian Conference of Health Economists, to be held in Melbourne.

## **What are the objectives of the award?**

- To recognize a significant research contribution in Australasian health economics.

## **What is the basis on which the award will be given?**

- Nominations for the award will be considered every two years.
- Nominations will relate to a particular publication that appeared in a refereed journal in the preceding two years.

## **Who is eligible?**

- Researchers who at the time of the nominated publication were undertaking their research in Australia or New Zealand irrespective of their nationality.
- Possible affiliations include Universities, research organisations, government departments or private companies in Australia or New Zealand.
- With joint authored work, 50% or more of authors must satisfy these criteria.

## **Who can nominate?**

- Anyone may nominate a publication for the prize.
- Eligible papers published in Journal of Health Economics or Health Economics in 2009 or 2010 will automatically be nominated
- In addition, the awarding Panel may nominate publications they feel should be included.

## **Who assesses the nominations?**

- A Panel made up of the President of AHES (or nominee) plus two further members nominated by the AHES Executive and one an internationally recognized health economist who is not a member of AHES.

## **The prize?**

\$500 and a certificate.

## **Nomination for 2011 Research Prize**

**An award promoting excellence in research in Australasian health economics**

<p><b>Name(s) and Affiliations of Nominee(s)</b> 50% or more of Nominees are required to have an Australian or New Zealand employer as their primary affiliation at the time of the nominated research.</p>
<p><b>Research article</b> Nominations will relate to a particular publication that appeared in a refereed journal in 2009-2010 inclusive.</p>
<p><b>Nominator</b> Anyone can act as the nominator.</p>
<p><b>Basis of nomination</b> Provide a brief summary of why the nominated research is worthy of the 2011 AHES Research Prize.</p>
